
#### **Academic Prominence:**

#### March 28, 2020: NPS goes online!


NPS Kalaburagi launched classes for grade 9 in the remote mode on Zoom Platform for the first time and earned the credit of being the first school in Kalaburagi to take up this initiative. The classes were meticulously planned as per the CBSE curriculum, and interactive modules.



At the end of May, a demo session with Extra Mark – an online platform - was organized and a couple of interactive sessions with the Microsoft team were also held to render a better learning platform for children. Eventually, taking into consideration an effective online platform to hold recorded teaching sessions for students, easy accessibility, sharing of materials to conduct and evaluation of online assessments, etc, the online classes were shifted on to the 'Google Classroom' on June 22nd, 2020.

#### **Preparation of Staff:**

Our teachers polish their practice so that more of our students can reach their learning goals and pursue excellence more vigorously through greater engagement with their learning and the use of thinking routines to ensure the successful development of teaching skills.



A series of webinars were hosted by eminent speakers and educationists to bring in awareness and raise the potential of our staff in utilizing the online platform effectively.

May 09, 2020: Dr. Namdev Chavan, (Assistant Professor of Psychiatry, MRMC Kalaburagi) organized a webinar on the topic– 'Adapting to the New Life after COVID-19'. It aimed at providing a clear idea to the parents to handle their children through the psychologically challenging pandemic time.



May 11th, 2020: An Online Teacher Training Programme was organized by Rtd. Col. Shekhar. A, (Educationist, Consultant, and Rt. Principal) on the theme 'How to Master Online Teaching – During and after COVID19'. The training program explored many effective tools to handle online classes.

May 12, 2020: A webinar for teachers was organized by Mrs. Sumedha Sodhi, (HOD of Social Science, GCED Coordinator, Ahlcon International School) the webinar was held in two sessions. The key focus of the webinar was how to utilize digital tools to make online learning easy and effective, blending of online methods of teaching and the conventional



techniques, and the tools to improve learning outcomes.



May 16, 2020: An Online Orientation Programme for Teachers was organized by Dr. Sushma Jogan, (Assistant Professor of Education) aiming at creating and assessing the online teaching tools. The mode of conducting an assessment and its evaluation was briefly explained and practiced during the session.

May 28 2020 Teacher Development Programme:

NPS organized an Online Teacher Development Programme for Teachers. Dr. Uthaya Kumar, (Education Consultant & Trainer) held a Live Session on Facebook about Holistic Education – Intellectual, Emotional, Social, Physical, Artistic, Creative and Spiritual Potentials.

**Nov 7, 2020:** An Online Workshop on Competency-based learning was held for the teachers at NPS. The workshop focused on online Assessment techniques and NEP 2020 highlights. Dr. Manjula Raman (CEO, Royale Concorde International Group of Schools) presided over the event and spoke to the teachers. The workshop was an eye-opener to the faculty as it cleared the doubts related to NEP.



**Parent Teachers Online Interactions:** The pandemic, no doubt, transformed homes into schools. The pandemic also taught that no matter schools may be closed by learning cannot stop at any cost. With proper coordination between the parents and the teachers, the students were provided with quality education with no compromise. To keep a check on the academic progress of the students, regular Parent-Teacher Meets were held online. NPS ensured to conduct such virtual interactions periodically during the pandemic session. The first Online PTM was held on 14 June 2021 to review the students' performance in their online classes. To further check the academic progress of the students of grades VI to IX, the second and third online PTMs were held on 26 July 2020 and 06 October 2020 respectively.

As we oscillated from online to offline classes, an offline Parent Teachers Meet for KG to Grade 9 was held on 16 January 2021 and 13 March 2021. To have a discussion and to receive feedback from parents before the final examination, a face-to-face interaction was held on 03 April 2020. The last PTM for the students of Grade 1 to 9 for the academic year was held on 07 May 2020. The PTM for the kindergarten children was held on 17 April 2020.

# **Student Support**

Teachers worked cooperatively to develop units of work and lesson plans focusing particularly on the quality of teaching and learning. Teachers are endeavoring to raise student achievement with increased scaffolding of concepts and content and more rubrics as feedback on assessment tasks. The Principal and staff continue to refine their approaches to purposeful grouping to enhance learning outcomes. Talented students in particular disciplines are identified and targeted where possible classes are formed to accelerate appropriate students.

Students with diagnosed learning difficulties receive assistance from teachers, including organization of study materials; prioritizing tasks to meet due dates; monitoring progress through assignments; study skills and examination preparation; and liaison with teachers and parents. Many students also received support through special examination provisions: retest and remedial classes.

#### The Assessment

Traditionally, we have Monthly Review Tests, Unit Tests, Half-Yearly and Yearly Examinations, and competition results as sources of information on the progress of our students. We need to make more of this information to design our teaching methodology and improve student outcomes. We set targets, publish exemplary work, use more pre-test and post-test strategies, compose more rubrics, compile more feedback sheets, produce more footpace, insist on standards being met for work submitted for assessment, and analyze and evaluate the data we gather at the end of each unit to improve our practice.

#### Feedback

We listen to our students and respond to their needs and concerns. We aim to identify and address student learning needs on a personal level. We have the tools to monitor each student's progress and to identify strengths and weaknesses in skill, concept, and knowledge acquisition. We hope to develop more targeted interventions to address specific needs. We conduct more online and offline surveys to establish student attitudes to school policies and programs, both academic and co-curricular. We try to respond appropriately to their concerns and suggestions for improvement. We evaluate our teaching more often by having exit surveys, feedback sheets, or in-class forums. We try to make schoolwork more meaningful and engaging by ensuring that where possible it is autonomous, complex and offering a reward for effort in the zone of proximal development. We also need to show how scores can be improved.

#### Targets for the upcoming academic year:

We felt strong on measuring students' reflection on assessment and therefore we rated ourselves as sustaining and growing rather than excelling. We have embedded practices to engage parents and help them understand the learning progress of their children, with more support strategies for parents trying to help their children to learn. The academic year 2021-22 will remain etched in the history of NPS as we prepare for the first batch of AISSE. Our students are provided with the best coaching and support to make a mark at the Board Exam. With fingers crossed, we are all set to face the board exams.

From the year of the conception, NPS has also looked forward to enhancing the learning environment of students. As a new academic year flutters open in front of us, we are armed to go along with the flow – both online and offline. We have meticulously planned a structured Online and Offline schedule for the classes and we are sure that the classes will not be affected by the pandemic anymore. Our teachers and students will be provided with orientation sessions to be prepared for the year to come. The academic year 2021-22 is all set to be inclusive of curricular and co-curricular activities. The activities will enable students to fight the monotony of the virtual classes and to improve their creativity.
